

On the positive side, our Democratic legislators are trying hard to help protect everyone's rights. Last week, Sen. Melissa Wintrow reintroduced Senate Bill 1101 to add the words sexual orientation and gender identity to the Idaho Human Rights Act. The update would protect all Idahoans from discrimination in housing, employment, and public accommodations. In a show of support, every Idaho House & Senate Democrat signed on as a co-sponsor.

Senate Joint Resolution 101 – Restricting Ballot Initiatives In 2021, Republican lawmakers passed a law to make citizen-led voter initiatives nearly impossible. The Idaho Supreme Court later ruled it

Constitution to take away that right. Don't let this happen.

Gay Marriage Bans (RS3000C1)

Mr. Herndon (R-D1) introduced a bill to prohibit gay marriage as he tries to skirt the SCOTUS decision in 2015 that affirmed everyone has a right to marry the person of their choice by getting rid of marriage licenses and affirming that marriage is only between a "man and a woman." On June 26, 2015, the United States Supreme Court ruled in a landmark decision that the 14th Amendment requires all states to license marriages between same-sex couples and to recognize all marriages that were lawfully performed out of state. However, after the fall of Roe v. Wade this past June, which was grounded in the right to privacy, there is concern that other civil rights will also be challenged, like this one.

Contact our Senator and Representatives and ask them to support Senate Bill 1101, and to reject limiting our rights to referendums and for people to choose who they marry.


Branding Democrats: A Top-to-Bottom Reimagining of Campaign Strategies
